Old Students Association Activities (2025-26)

On 11 February 2026, Darshan, an alumnus of Government College Sainj, conducted a session on online form filling to assist first-year students. During the session, he guided students on registering themselves on the University portal and helped them complete the annual examination form process.

Scholarships

Under the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) Scheme, scholarships for students belonging to Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), Other Backward Classes (OBC), and IRDP categories are credited directly to their bank accounts. During the 2025–26 academic session, the college organized an awareness campaign to inform students about the various scholarship schemes offered by both the Central and State Governments. The initiative helped students understand the eligibility criteria and application procedures, resulting in a noticeable increase in the number of applicants seeking financial assistance during the session.

Library

The college library currently houses 787 books, comprising a diverse collection across various subjects, including important reference materials. To keep students and faculty updated with current affairs, the library regularly subscribes to newspapers such as Punjab Kesari, Divya Himachal, The Economic Times, and The Indian Express. In addition, popular magazines like Pratiyogita Darpan, Yojana, and Kurukshetra are made available on a quarterly basis, helping readers stay informed about competitive examinations, public policy, and national developments.

Annual College Magazine: *Valley Vibes*

The annual college magazine, *Valley Vibes*, serves as a platform for students to express their creativity through writing, art, and research. It reflects the academic and cultural life of the institution by bringing together students' ideas, experiences, and achievements. Through essays, poems, artworks, and reflections, the magazine encourages creativity, critical thinking, and confidence in self-expression while also documenting important campus activities and initiatives.

The magazine is divided into four sections—Local Environment, Campus Life, Creative Writing and Arts, and Research Insights—and is published on the college website.

As part of the campaign, several initiatives were undertaken, including the installation of interior and exterior signages, maintenance of a clean and tobacco-free campus, and various awareness programmes such as the Anti-Tobacco Pledge, debates, poster-making and slogan-writing competitions, and awareness rallies, organized periodically to sensitize students about the harmful effects of tobacco use.
